






This quarter WRUP published its latest monograph, *Understanding Mental Causation;* received several enquiries for potential new works; and saw 4 already commissioned works move into the final phases of development.

This quarter also sees the first anniversary of the publication of *Children's Culture and Citizenship in Argentina*. Since its publication in November 2023, this volume has seen 5220 views and 1382 downloads.

Latest publication





WRUP was very pleased to announce the publication of our latest monograph in December: *Understanding Mental Causation*, by Dr. Andrea White. Within the first month of its launch, *Understanding Mental Causation* had over 1200 views and 350 downloads

"I'm really pleased to share my research in <u>Understanding Mental Causation</u>," said Dr. White, "and the fact that this book is open access and so can reach the widest possible audience should lead to interesting discussions. I think open access publishing is really important and hope it will become more commonplace." Dr White's volume is the first publication from the inaugural <u>Leeds Early Career Publishing Prize (ECPP)</u>. The next iteration of the prize will be launched in February 2025. At WRUP we like to periodically highlight one of our published volumes, to celebrate their reach and impact. Voices and Practices in Applied Linguistics: Diversifying a Discipline is a selection of original applied linguisticsbased research, drawing together papers from the 2017 British Association for Applied Linguistics (BAAL) conference. The volume highlights current globalised perspectives on diversity in language use and communication, across a variety of contexts, and with a rich mix of frameworks, methodologies and participants.

This volume has seen significant and global useage since its publication, with over **10,800 views** and **7,600 downloads.** It's also WRUP's most cited monograph, with **63 citations** in other works.



WRUP was thrilled to share details of the three winners of the Sheffield Doctoral Publishing Prize in December:


- Lucas Gastiarena (Education) Argentine tango through the lens of cynicism: Elements of disenchantment, pessimism, and rebelliousness in tango culture across its history
- Owen Gurrey (English) John Burnside's poetics
- Yiyun Liu (Music) Rationality and sensibility in Handel's London stage: A comprehensive study of his 1730-1745 works

We're looking forward to working with these individuals, who will have the opportunity to present a monograph proposal to the WRUP Editorial Board for consideration. Preparation is underway for the upcoming Leeds iteration of the prize, which will be announced in the new year.

WRUP advocacy and comms



This quarter has seen the beginning of a renewed focus on advocacy and unified comms for WRUP, to raise awareness and emphasise its role as the University Press for the three institutions. To support this, a Unified Comms Plan has been developed, ratified by the Management Board, detailing key strategies for raising WRUP's profiles across the sites. Together with institutional colleagues, Lucy Cook (WRUP Publications and Communications Assistant) has been working hard to strengthen WRUP's online presence through renewed social media and a review of institutional webpages, engaging with teams across the sites to raise awareness of the Press, and beginning the process of organising events and sessions for the coming year.



In December, the <u>updated White Rose Libraries website</u> was launched, with new and informative pages for each of WRL's strands of activity, including <u>White Rose University Press.</u> This allows visitors to see how WRUP fits into the overall strategy and work of White Rose Libraries, and provides a space to surface reports on WRUP activity.

WRUP further increased its online presence in December by launching a dedicated <u>Bluesky account</u>. This will allow the Press to reach academics and colleagues in the wider community and engage in conversations across the sector.



From 21st-27th October, WRUP celebrated International Open Access week, joining other institutions globally in celebrating the theme of Community over Commercialisation. The team was thrilled to take part in events and conferences throughout the week, attending virtual events including the British Library's Open and Engaged Conference, focused on open scholarship, open infrastructure, emerging technologies, skills development and sustainable models. Kate Petherbridge (WRUP Press Manager) also spoke at a bitesize webinar hosted by the University of Sheffield to offer an introduction to WRUP and open access publishing. WRUP was pleased to attend both virtual and in-person events this quarter.

In October, WRUP Press Manager Kate Petherbridge was invited to speak at the <u>Plan S and Beyond for Publishers and Societies</u> event hosted by ALPSP.

The team attended a screening of the short film *The Nervous State* at the University of Sheffield, the subject of an upcoming WRUP volume. It was great to celebrate the project with the authors of the monograph and we look forward to publishing this work soon.

In November, the team attended the Open Research Champions Network and Open Research Hub launch event in Leeds. As an open access press, WRUP works closely with the Open Research team in Leeds, and it was wonderful to celebrate the progress being made in this area.
