


The upgrade to the infrastructure for both WRRO and WREO is now complete. Following the successful move of WREO (White Rose Etheses Online) onto the live server at the beginning of January, WRRO (White Rose Research Online) has now also been upgraded to the latest version of Eprints.

There was a period of user testing, where colleagues at the three institutions explored the functionality and usability of the new platform, before WRRO was migrated to the live server at the end of March. WRL is very grateful to John Salter, our Technical Support officer, for successfully implementing the upgrade, and to colleagues at the three institutions for their help in testing the new platforms. WRL have agreed to explore the viability of a shared Open Learning Assets Repository. The Repositories Board is now investigating the potential to deliver this repository via EPrints, to sit alongside the existing shared repositories; WRRO and WREO. Task and finish group(s) will be convened to undertake detailed scoping of both the technical aspects and the workflows, processes, and resourcing that would be required.

In a parallel discussion, the three site are also exploring the viability of a shared PressBooks licence, to see if there are advantages to working on this with a consortial approach.



Following the successful upgrade to the repositories infrastructure, the WRL team is now planning the next stage of work on the repositories, which is to add Multi Factor Authentication via institutional Single Sign On.

This will improve the security of accounts in WRRO and WREO. Work on investigating and implementing MFA is scheduled to begin in June.



WRL has successfully applied for a Research Organisation Registry ID. ROR is a global, community-led registry of open persistent identifiers for research organizations, and will be used to identify and connect outputs from WRL.


The WRL ROR is also connected to the RORs for White Rose University Consortium, and the Universities of Leeds, Sheffield, and York, connecting these as related organisations.



Between January -March 2025, there were 349,383 total downloads from WREO


